Dr. Michelle Grinman is a General Internal Medicine Specialist and health services researcher with expertise in Hospital at Home, Virtual Care, and Integration of Care. She is also Section Deputy Chief for General Internal Medicine at the University of Calgary, and Scientific Director of the Hospital Medicine Section for the Medicine Strategic Clinical Network in Alberta Health Services.

Throughout her career, Dr. Grinman has led research and quality improvement initiatives that improve access to care for vulnerable populations, incorporate the use of innovative technologies to enhance care delivery, and practices that lead to healthcare system sustainability. She has led the conceptualization and implementation of two hospital at home programs in the province of Alberta - the Complex Care Hub in Calgary and the Wetaskiwin Rural Home Hospital program. She also led the creation of the Integrated Long-term Care Program in Toronto, Canada, and the Calgary Zone Long-COVID Inter-professional Outpatient Program in Calgary, Canada.
