This talk will discuss how design thinking principles are currently being applied to a potential redesign of medical education. We will explore the fundamentals of design thinking methodology and describe how we used these principles to understand current pain points in undergraduate medical education.

Dr. Rahim Kachra is the Director of Teaching Innovations at the Cumming School of Medicine, Internal Medicine Clerkship Director, and Clinical Associate Professor at the University of Calgary. He is a specialist in General Internal Medicine, with an interest in innovative approaches to the delivery of medical education and patient care.

Dr. Kachra completed his MD and post-graduate medical education at the University of Calgary, and received a Master of Education in Technology, Innovation, & Education from the Harvard University Graduate School of Education. He currently works at the Foothills Medical Centre.
