This seminar will introduce students to metrics and tools to track individual research impact. Platforms to assist researchers to collate, track, and analyze research impact, including ORCID, Scopus, and Google Scholar will be highlighted and discussed.

Diane coordinates the O'Brien Institute for Public Health's Research Impact Portfolio.

2. Recall the benefits of creating an ORCID profile.
3. Distinguish between research metrics produced by Scopus and Google Scholar.
